The project to partially restore the fountain in Linslade Recreation Ground has been progressing well and the next stage will be the replacement of the missing lion's head.




Linslade Recreation Ground where you can find the fountain

Launching Soon!

Our newest addition to our Buzzard Trails, called the "Sands of Time" is an audio voyage around Leighton Buzzard that recounts memories of people with a connection to sand who lived and worked in the area.
