Our Christmas Festival Weekend kicks off the festive season in Leighton-Linslade and runs from Friday 24 – Sunday 26 November in the High Street.

On Friday evening from 16:00 hours onwards our festive market featuring handmade crafts and gifts, funfair and a stage programme packed full of local acts and performances, provides something for everyone before and after the switch on ceremony and fireworks display at 19:00 hours. The festive food-court in Church Square includes freshly made hot street food, perfect for a winters evening and our elves begin their long weekend of cheekiness.

On Saturday, the Leighton Fun Runners Santa Dash will take place from Parson's Close Recreation Ground with hundreds of Santas charging through the streets of Leighton-Linslade. Our festive markets continue with the Charter Market taking place alongside the Handmade and Craft Market who will be joined by Sparky The Robot and local performing groups bringing some festive cheer to the Town Centre.

From 11:00 hours on Sunday, our festive shopping opportunities are back on the high street, perfect for those looking for a unique gift for that loved one. There will also be performances from Wendy Sings & LSJ Trio, while Sami Sleigh, Lairy Fairy & The Christmas Puddings alongside some naughty Sofa Driving Santas will fill the market with the sounds of laughter, mischief and mayhem. UPDATE ON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

At its meeting on 25 September, the Council appointed consultants Oneill Homer to help us with scoping work on a Neighbourhood Plan.

The scoping work will aim to make recommendations on the designated neighbourhood area, policy areas to be included and likely timescales and resources needed to undertake the plan development.

Fancy a Movie?

Have you heard about the Movies for the More Mature film club? Leighton Buzzard Library Theatre, supported by the Town Council, offer discounted movie tickets for residents of the Parish who are aged 55 or over. Showings take place on Wednesday afternoons and include free refreshments!

The trail will have you looking for swans, gargoyles, shadows, numbers and boot scrapers! It's a great way to develop imagination and conversation as you explore the town.

Collect your workbook from the Library or Town Council offices at the White House, then use the map on the back (and the blue plaques on the floor) to navigate around the town.
