On Friday evening from 16:00 hours onwards our festive market featuring handmade crafts and gifts, funfair and a stage programme packed full of local

On Saturday, the Leighton Fun Runners Santa Dash will take place from Parson's Close Recreation Ground with hundreds of Santas charging through the streets of Leighton-Linslade. Our festive markets continue with the Charter Market taking place

alongside the Handmade and Craft Market who will be joined by Sparky The Robot and local performing groups bringing some festive cheer to the Town Centre.

From 11:00 hours on Sunday, our festive shopping opportunities are back on the high street, perfect for those looking for a unique gift for that loved one.

There will also be performances from Wendy Sings & LSJ Trio, while Sami Sleigh, Lairy Fairy & The Christmas Puddings alongside some naughty Sofa Driving Santas will fill the market with the sounds of laughter, mischief and mayhem. At its meeting on 25 September, the Council appointed consultants Oneill Homer to help us with scoping work on a Neighbourhood Plan.

The scoping work will aim to make recommendations on the designated neighbourhood area, policy areas to be included and likely timescales and resources needed to undertake the plan development.





REMEMBRANCE

This year's Remembrance Sunday parade and service will take place on 12 November, with the parade leaving Lake Street at around 10:35 hours, followed by the formal wreath laying and blessing in Church Square from 11:00 hours. A service inside All Saints Church will follow, to which all are warmly invited to attend. The ceremony will be live-streamed for those unable to attend in person.

Following on, an act of Remembrance will take place at the Linslade War Memorial at 12:45 hours. This will be recorded and made available online afterwards.

The Town Council would like to thank the local residents who have donated knitted and crocheted poppies this year. We are delighted to be able to build on last year's display which was so well received by our community.
